

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


EXPLORE SCENIC IOWA

Here in the extreme northeast part of the state, natural wonders and engineering feats create an inviting environment for Iowa photographer Brian Abeling

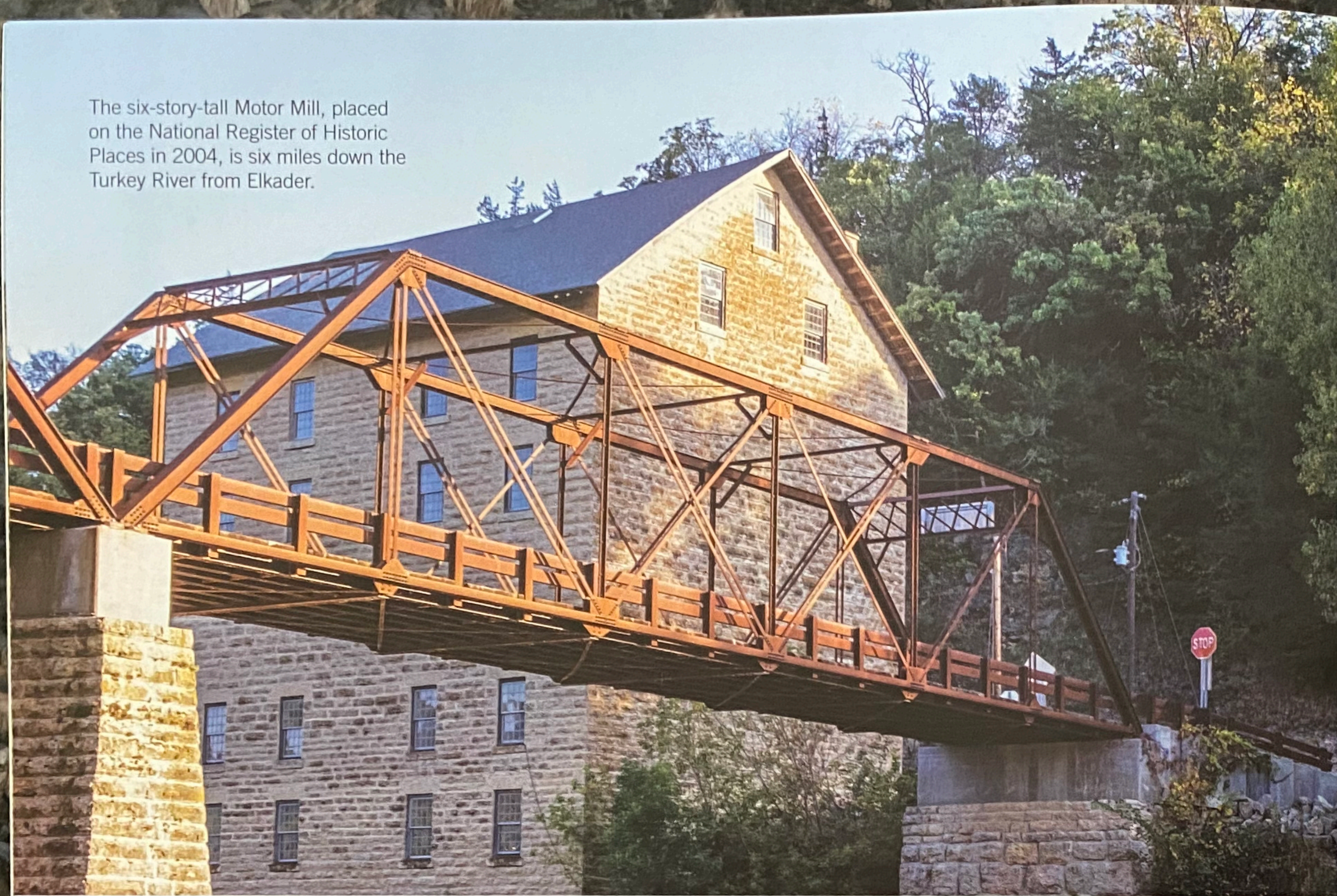

Tubing and boating on the Mississippi River, under the Black Hawk Bridge (also called the Lansing Bridge), which connects Lansing to Wisconsin.

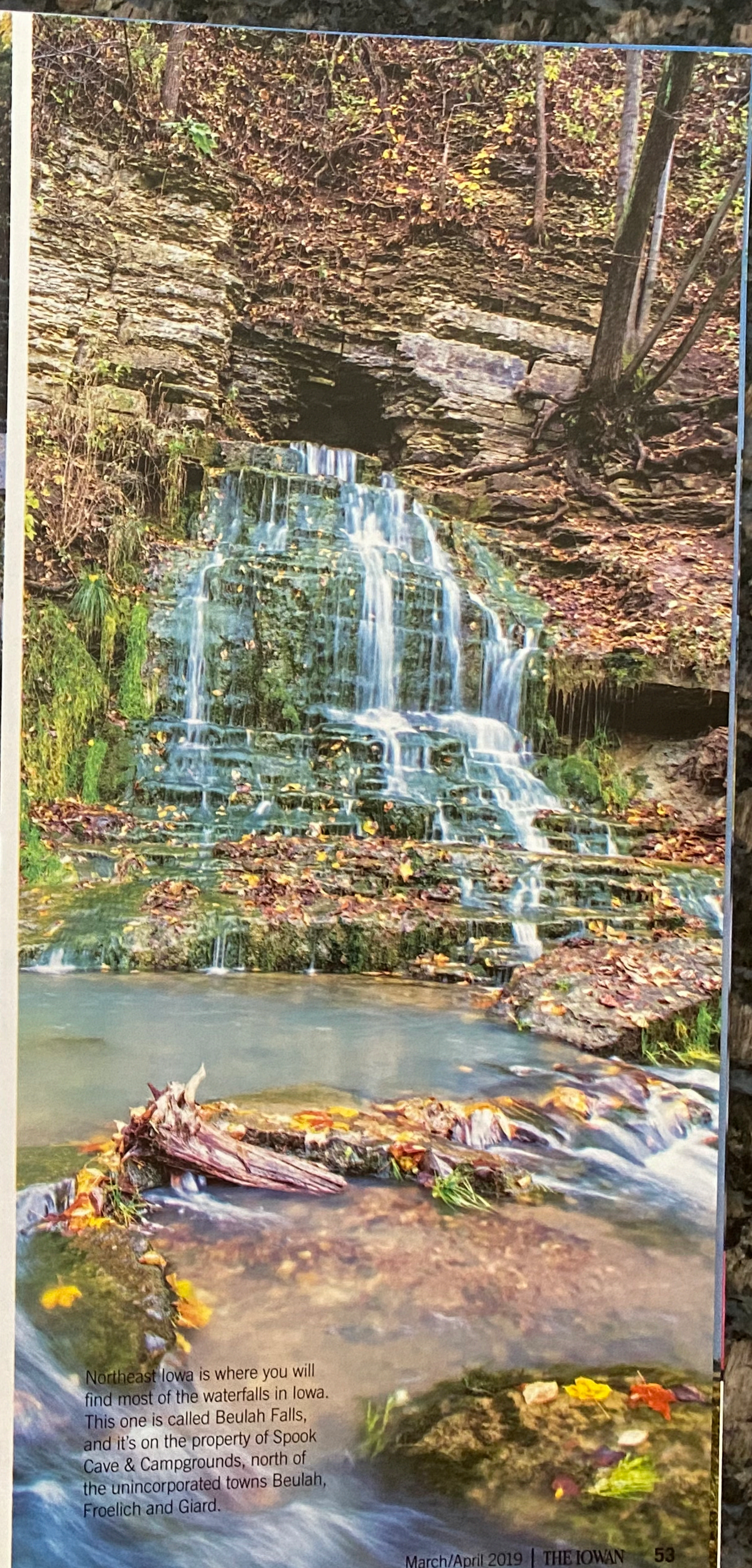


A wider view of the Black Hawk Bridge shows the town of Lansing. The bridge appeared in the 1999 David Lynch movie "The Straight Story."

The six-story-tall Motor Mill, placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 2004, is six miles down the Turkey River from Elkader.

Northeast Iowa is where you will find most of the waterfalls in Iowa. This one is called Beulah Falls, and it's on the property of Spook Cave & Campgrounds, north of the unincorporated towns Beulah, Froelich and Giard.



The Mooney Stone Home in Allamakee County was built in 1853 by Michael Mooney, Sr., and his family, who left Ireland in 1839. They chose this location for their home because the landscape reminded them of Ireland. The house was built by hand and is still treasured by the Mooney family today. A family descendant maintains the property, though just parts of three walls are left standing. Visitors are welcome. You'll find the structure on the north side of Sweet Ridge Road (county road A52) between Conway Road and Mullen Road.
